### Scripture Verses (ALL AGES)

**John 17:14-19** – <sup>14</sup> I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. <sup>15</sup> I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. <sup>16</sup> They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. <sup>17</sup> Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. <sup>18</sup> As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. <sup>19</sup> And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth.

**Romans 12:1-2** – I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. <sup>2</sup> Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

**Matthew 28:18-19** – <sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

**Matthew 5:10-12** – <sup>10</sup> "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. <sup>11</sup> "Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. <sup>12</sup> Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

**Matthew 5:14-16** – <sup>14</sup> "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. <sup>15</sup> Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. <sup>16</sup> In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.

**1 John 2:15-17** – <sup>15</sup> Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. <sup>16</sup> For all that is in the world-- the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride of life-- is not from the Father but is from the world. <sup>17</sup> And the world is passing away along with its desires, but whoever does the will of God abides forever.

**Romans 8:28-31** – <sup>28</sup> And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose. <sup>29</sup> For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers. <sup>30</sup> And those whom he predestined he also called, and those whom he called he also justified, and those whom he justified he also glorified. <sup>31</sup> What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?

**Colossians 3:16-17** – <sup>16</sup> Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. <sup>17</sup> And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

## **First Catechism (4<sup>th</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> Graders Only)**

*Q16. Who were our first parents?*

A. Adam and Eve.

*Q17. How did God create man?*

A. God created man, male and female, after his own image.

*Q18. Of what were our first parents made?*

A. God made Adam's body out of the ground and Eve's body out of a rib from Adam.

*Q19. What else did God give Adam and Eve besides bodies?*

A. He gave them souls that will last forever.

*Q20. Do you have a soul as well as a body?*

A. Yes. And my soul is going to last forever.

*Q21. How do you know your soul will last forever?*

A. Because the Bible tells me so.

*Q22. In what condition did God make Adam and Eve?*

A. He made them holy and happy.

Q23. *What covenant did God make with Adam?*

A. The covenant of life.

Q24. *What is a covenant?*

A. A relationship that God establishes with us and guarantees by his word.

Q25. *In the covenant of life, what did God require Adam to do?*

A. To obey God perfectly.

Q26. *What did God promise in the covenant of life?*

A. To reward Adam with life if he obeyed God perfectly.

Q27. *What did God threaten in the covenant of life?*

A. To punish Adam with death if he disobeyed God.

Q28. *Did Adam keep the covenant of life?*

A. No. He sinned against God.

Q29. *What is sin?*

A. Sin is any lack of conformity to, or transgression of, the law of God.

Q30. *What is meant by lack of conformity?*

A. Not being or doing what God requires.

Q31. *What is meant by transgression?*

A. Doing what God forbids.

Q32. *What does every sin deserve?*

A. The wrath and curse of God.

## **Shorter Catechism (6<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> Graders)**

Q. 9. *What is the work of creation?*

A. The work of creation is God's making all things of nothing, by the word of his power, in the space of six days, and all very good.

Q. 10. *How did God create man?*

A. God created man male and female, after his own image, in knowledge, righteousness and holiness, with dominion over the creatures.

Q. 11. *What are God's works of providence?*

A. God's works of providence are his most holy, wise and powerful preserving and governing all his creatures, and all their actions.

Q. 12. *What special act of providence did God exercise toward man in the estate wherein he was created?*

A. When God had created man, he entered into a covenant of life with him, upon condition of perfect obedience; forbidding him to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, upon the pain of death.

Q. 13. *Did our first parents continue in the estate wherein they were created?*

A. Our first parents, being left to the freedom of their own will, fell from the estate wherein they were created, by sinning against God.

Q. 14. *What is sin?*

A. Sin is any want of conformity unto, or transgression of, the law of God.

Q. 15. *What was the sin whereby our first parents fell from the estate wherein they were created?*

A. The sin whereby our first parents fell from the estate wherein they were created was their eating the forbidden fruit.

Q. 16. *Did all mankind fall in Adam's first transgression?*

A. The covenant being made with Adam, not only for himself, but for his posterity; all mankind, descending from him by ordinary generation, sinned in him, and fell with him, in his first transgression.
