The Love of Christ's Church

Do you know the love of the Church of Christ? The love of the Church is evident in our walk - one cannot hide the depth of gratitude owed her.

All who have recited the Apostles Creed have confessed with their mouths: "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of the saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting." The saints of the Lord do more than believe the holy catholic Church, by the very nature of having been purchased in the blood of the Lamb, they love being part of her. Christians are followers of Jesus the anointed redeemer, and cannot help being passionate about the Church.

In Ephesians 5:25-27, Paul says: "... Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might **sanctify her**, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without **blemish.**" The redeemed in Christ have been presented to the Father as the elect, holy and without blemish. Peter goes a step further (1 Peter 2:9-10) when he says: "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy."

By definition you are in love with the body of Christ, His Church. As certainly as God is our Father, the Church is our Mother. How can we not love our mother? She is the one who nurtures us. Calvin says: "... let us learn, from her single title of mother, how useful, nay, how necessary the knowledge of her is, since there is no other means of entering into life unless she conceives us in the womb and give us birth, unless she nourishes us at her breasts, and in short, keep us under her charge and government, until, divested of mortal flesh, we become like the angels (Matthew 22:30). For our weakness does not permit us to leave the school until we have spent our whole lives as scholars.

Moreover, beyond the pale of the Church no forgiveness of sins, no salvation, can be hoped for, as Isaiah and Joel testify (Isaiah 37:32; Joel 2:32). Source: Calvin's Institutes Book 4.1.4.

The Church is the storehouse of love and kindness. Within her we receive Word and sacrament to build us up and to strengthen us for the battles of life. Within her is true fellowship, communal prayer, joyous song, and a pleasing cadence of ritual and repetition. Within her the saints are closer than any outside her walls. The warmth of Christ radiates within her, he is her light reaching even the most remote parts of the world.

The Lord God provides men who are able to teach; shepherds to lead the lambs to peaceful waters, able to lead them to nutritious food. God's voice resounds from them while yet they walk according to the light of His Word. As children of light, let us never forget to share the love of Christ and the love of Church, calling the stranger to join her ramparts that they too may know redeeming grace and mercy.

- That the church may be a light that draws strangers into the house of the Living God.


OPC Mission Work

Evangelism Work

Houston Harvey Mission - Rev. Nick Lamme

While the work in Houston has only recently begun, we want to praise God that he has already begun to open doors for ministry among those who are still grappling with the effects of Hurricane Harvey. Here is brief outline of opportunities and prayer requests.

We have had extended opportunities with one family who is in dire straits. Their names are Daniel and Crystal. They have two young boys, Leon (4 years) and Samuel (10 months). Their house was completely destroyed in the hurricane and they have been living out of an RV for the last 11 months. We have been able to help them with food and other assistance, and are actively working with their home church to see how we can best serve their needs and show Christ's love to them in what has been the most difficult time of their lives.

I have also been regularly visiting a widow in Spring, TX named Lynne. Lynne is 82 years old and apart from the damage that the storm did to her house, this last year, she also lost her daughter to cancer. Not only have I had opportunity to pray with her and minister the Word, but we are also working to help her install cabinets and make other small repairs to her house.
