Presbyterian Government

The Bible Presbyterian Church operates under a Presbyterian form of government because the Apostles established a representative form of government where the elected spiritual leaders, called elders or presbyters, make up the session of the local church to oversee affairs of the church.

The Bible Presbyterian denomination consists of one synod, four presbyteries, and 20 local churches. There are over 40 ministers listed on the roll. Each of these courts has its own distinct function in the worship of God, the promulgation of the faith, and the discipline of the church. The denomination adopts the Westminster Standards (Confession of Faith, Larger and Shorter Catechisms) along with the Book of Discipline and Form of Government as its constitution.

Local Churches

Each church is governed by a session, composed of the minister(s) and ruling elder(s), which administers the affairs and discipline of the church. Congregations approve or disapprove sessional recommendations such as extending calls to ministers and church budgets. Each congregation owns its own property and approves by-laws that help apply the Constitution to the local situation.

Presbyteries

A presbytery consisting of ministers and elder delegates represents each congregation in a certain geographic region. The presbytery duties include:

- Receiving and ruling on all appeals and complaints brought before it from sessions;
- Overseeing the spiritual welfare of the local churches in the region;
- Providing accountability for ministers and local churches;
- Examining, ordaining, installing, and judging ministers and missionaries;

- Ministering together in mutual projects across the region, such as church planting efforts, camps, seminars, evangelistic efforts, and so on.

Concerning Ecclesiastical Fellowship

The BPC has a strong commitment to a Scriptural purity in associations. Such purity has been important to the character, activity, and development of the denomination from its inception. This commitment has guided our fellowship with other major Protestant denominations that hold to the essential doctrines of Christianity and recognize the Bible as their only infallible rule of faith and practice. She opposes ecumenicity that seeks to bring together all churches without regard for their doctrine or faithfulness. At the same time, she extends the hand of fellowship and cooperation to other churches and ministries that endeavor to remain faithful to the Word of God. The Bible Presbyterian Church and the Orthodox Presbyterian Church have established a relationship of ecclesiastical relationship.

PRAYERS:

- For continued faithful walk, witness and growth.
- For continued warmth in fellowship between the BPC and the OPC.
- That the her saints shall be protected from harm in all her reaches world-wide.

Sister Congregation

Bible Presbyterian Church, Grand Island, NY - Kevin M. Backus, Ph.D., Sr. Pastor

Pastor Kevin Backus and his wife Sharon have been members of Bible Presbyterian since they came to Christ as teenagers. Kevin joined the pastoral staff of Bible Presbyterian Church, Grand Island, in 1982. In 1998 the



congregation extended a call to him to become the Senior Pastor. His commitment to the sufficiency of Scripture is evident in all he does; and the congregation cherishes his gifted teaching, counseling and leadership which sets the tone for his ministry and is instrumental to the equipping of the church.

OPC Congregation

Hillsdale OPC, MI - Rev. Everett Henes

Hillsdale OPC began as a church plant in October 2007 after local families and students of Hillsdale College petitioned the Presbytery of Michigan and Ontario.

During those formative months there was a session, appointed by the Presbytery, consisting of Glenn Jerrell,

Richard Gamble, and John Deliyannides. Peter Wallace served as the ministerial adviser. In 2008 a planting pastor (Everett Henes) was called, ordained, and installed. The work grew slowly in the coming years until it was able to petition the Presbytery, in 2015, to be recognized as a particular church. In 2013 the church was able to purchase a building near enough to Hillsdale College so they could continue their work of ministering to both community and college.



Rev. Everett Henes was installed at that time as pastor of the congregation. Everett was born and raised in Southern California. He did not grow up in a church but came to faith in his teenage years through a youth ministry at a local Foursquare Church. Sensing a call to the ministry, early on, Everett began to study and serve in various capacities in local congregations. In the coming years he would hold various jobs while discerning how to prepare for ministry. Everett married Kimberly in 1997 and they would go on to have five children.

In 2001 both Everett and Kimberly came to understand the doctrines of grace and joined a local OPC while they were in college. After college, Everett and his family moved to Philadelphia where he pursued his MDiv at Westminster Theological Seminary. Upon graduating in 2008 he was called to serve as church planter at Hillsdale OPC. Everett's background in working with young people – and his energy – made him the perfect fit for the congregation.

Since arriving in Hillsdale Everett has continued his education, completing a ThM in Systematic Theology at Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary in Grand Rapids and currently finishing his Doctor of Ministry at Reformed Presbyterian Theological Seminary in Pittsburgh. His dissertation is Biblical-Theological and Historical defense of simplicity in Reformed worship.

Hillsdale OPC focuses on the ministry of Word and Sacrament, meeting twice every Lord's Day. There are various activities for all ages in the church, including a

college Bible study at the pastor's home, women's and men's Bible studies, a midweek Dinner & Theology meeting, and a Paideia Discussion Group (RTS) at both the church and on the campus of Hillsdale College (sponsored by the church).



The pastor meets with the college students, every Friday, on the campus and also writes a column for the local newspapers. Their small congregation has had quite a bit of sadness in recent years with several miscarriages and two infant deaths. Their families have been strong, but prayers for continued strength and hope in the resurrection is greatly appreciated. Hillsdale OPC have a solid group of men who lead and serve the congregation.

This is a church of mostly college people in a college town. The town/gown divide is real and they pray often that the Lord would add more community families. Lastly, Hillsdale OPC is a very active and young congregation.

Whenever you visit Hillsdale, MI, please make contact with Pastor Henes, he welcomes the opportunity to explain the hope that drives the work of this congregation.
